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INTRODUCTION

Session Law 2007-322 and Chapter 143-64.70 of the North Carolina General Statues require the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) and the Office of State Personnel (OSP) to report annually on the use of personal services contracts¹ by State departments, agencies, institutions, and other State entities, hereafter referred to as "State agencies", that have annual expenditures greater than \$25,000. The report should include information on the type, number, duration, cost, and effectiveness of the personal services contracts. The report must be submitted to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations by March 15 of each year.

Methodology

OSBM requested State agencies to provide information on the personal services contracts which they used during fiscal year 2009-10, hereafter referred to as FY 2010, with expenditures greater than \$25,000. The requested information included general agency details, contract specifications, the nature of the services, the duration of the contracts, financial data, and other contractual information. The information submitted to OSBM by the State agencies was assembled, verified, and analyzed to ensure its completeness and accuracy. Additionally, the personal service contract data for previous fiscal year reports has been included in this report for comparative purposes.

BACKGROUND

The use of personal services contracts enables State agencies to acquire professional services for short term basis without creating state positions. These contracts provide agencies with an opportunity to obtain professional services that may be difficult to recruit for State positions. For example, the Department of Correction uses personal service contracts to provide physicians, nurses, chaplains, and other services to care for inmates. These types of contracts often require the contractors to work for extended periods of time, but for a limited number of hours each week. Because these type of contracts are often in remote locations and demanding work environments, these positions may be difficult to fill, and can be best addressed through personal services contracts. OSP also contracts for the services of training instructors on limited basis for extended periods of time because of their specific expertise in certain educational areas. Personal services contracts are classified as "independent contractors" as defined by the Fair Labor Standards Act and the Internal Revenue Service. Therefore, State agencies do not have to pay the costs of health benefits, withholding taxes, Social Security contributions, workers' compensation, and overtime.

While personal services contracts are an efficient and effective way for agencies to accomplish the specific needs and special skills, State agencies should be careful to not abuse or misuse this contracting method. It is also important for agencies to routinely evaluate their personal services contracts to ensure compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act and Internal Revenue Service regulations, and applicable North Carolina Administrative Codes and procurement regulations.

RESULTS

Summary Tables and Charts

The tables and graphs on the following pages provide summary data on the types, number, and costs of personal services contracts for FY 2010, in addition to historical information for the four previous FYs - 2006 through 2009. Appendix A provides the definitions for the types of personal services contracts.

¹ Section II of the State Purchasing Manual defines a personal services contract as: "...services provided by a professional individual (person) on a temporary or occasional basis, including (by way of illustration, not limitation) those provided by a doctor, dentist, attorney, architect, professional engineer, scientist or performer of the fine arts and similar professions; the exemption applies only if the individual is using his/her professional skills to perform a professional task; a personal service may also be a consultant service, in which case consultant contracting procedures shall be followed." Specifically excluded from this definition are "service contracts" between an agency and a company that provides services, such as lawn or housekeeping."

Table 1 summarizes the personal services contract information for FYs 2006 through FY 2010 for contracts greater than \$25,000. The summary includes the number, costs, and duration of contracts as well as the number of contractors, average number of contracts per contractor, number of state employees overseeing the contracts, and the average length of contracts. The last column of Table 1 also shows that the number, dollar amount, and duration of the personal services contracts declined for all categories except one between FY 2006 and FY 2010 data. The average number of months for all contract categories increased from 16.1 months for FY 2006 to 17.1 months for FY 2010.

Table 2 shows the number of contracts, amounts spent, and average expenditure for personal services contracts by personal service category for FY 2010. The health and medical services category accounted for one-third of the total contracts and more than 36 percent of the expenditures for FY 2010.

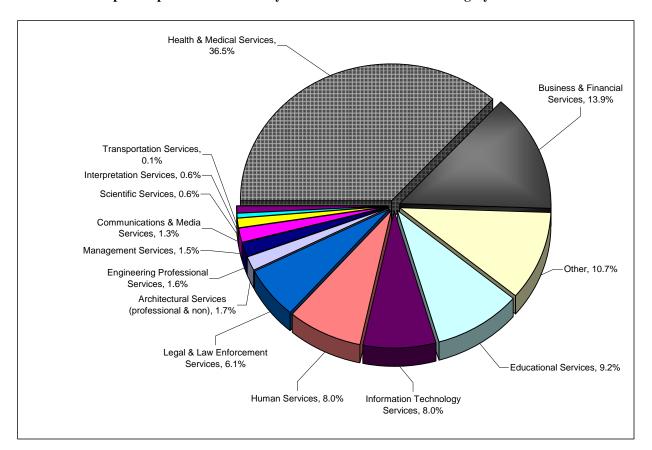

Table 3 on page 3 shows the personal services contracts for FYs 2006 through 2010 by category, the amount expended, number of contracts, and average months per contract. The Health and Medical Services contracts consistently had the largest amount spent for all five FYs (FY 2006 thru FY 2010).

Graph 1 shows the percent of the FY 2010 expenditures by personal service category. Health & Medical Services and Business & Financial Services used the most personal services contracts; accounting for over 50 percent (\$14.0 million) of all contract expenditures.



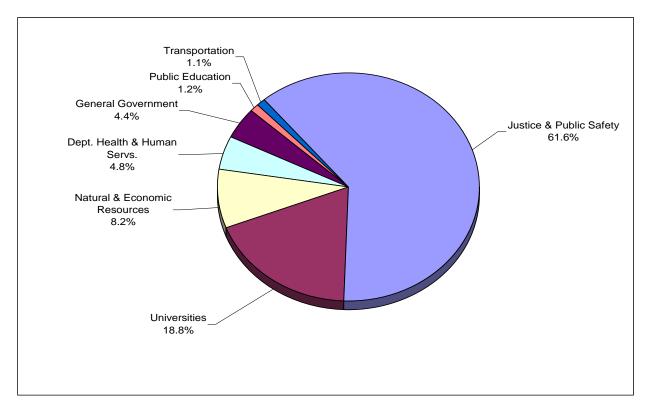
Graph 1 Expenditure Percents by Personal Service Contract Category for FY 2010

Table 4 shows the dollar amount expended and number of contracts by government entities for FYs 2006-2010. The Justice & Public Safety entity had the largest number of contracts and amount spent on personal services contracts. These contracts were primarily in the Department of Correction for providing health and medical services. Appendix B provides entity information at the agency level for FYs 2006 through 2010.

Graph 2 shows the percent of expenditures by government entity for FY 2010. Justice & Public Safety accounted for 61.6% of all the personal services contract expenditures by government entities.



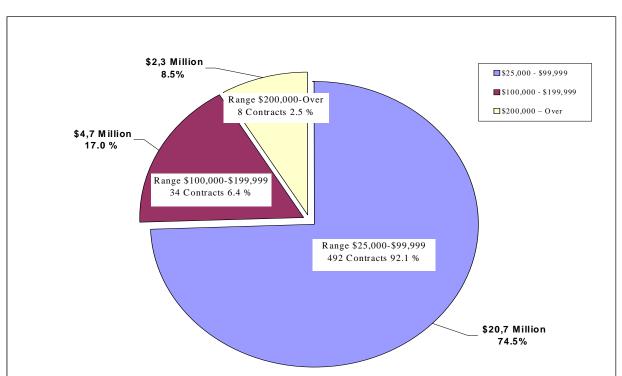
Graph 2-FY 2010 Percent of Expenditures by Government Entity

The data reported to OSBM by State agencies were also compiled by fund categories to show the type of funds used for the personal services contracts. Table 5 shows the amounts and percent of expenditures for FYs 2006 through 2010. As would be expected, the General Fund accounted for the majority of expenditures throughout the reporting period, accounting for 79.6% of FY 2010 expenditures. The General Funds account expenditures for FY 2010 represented 430 (80.5%) of the personal services contracts out of a total of 534 contracts. Overall, there was a net decrease of \$3.1 million (10.0%) in the personal services contract expenditures from FY 2010, with seven of the nine funding categories having net decreases.

The total expenditures for personal services contracts of \$25,000 or greater for FY 2010 were \$27.7 million. The information collected on personal services contracts was also grouped by dollar ranges. As shown in graph 3, the contracts ranging from \$25,000 to \$99,999 accounted for \$20.7 million (74.5%) of the total personal services contract expenditures for FY 2010. This range also accounted for the largest number of contracts awarded with 492 contracts (92.1%) for FY 2010. The contracts of \$100,000 and greater accounted for \$7.0 million (25.5%) of the total contract expenditures.



Graph 3-Personal Service Contract Expenditures by Dollar Range for FY 2010

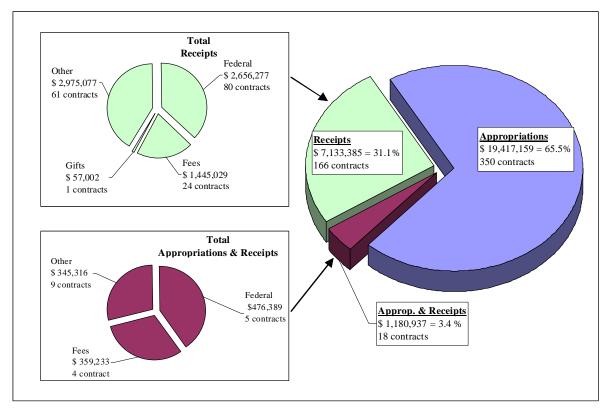

Graph 4 shows the funding sources for FY 2010 regarding contract expenditures – Appropriations (65.5%), Receipts (31.1%), and Appropriations & Receipts (3.4%). Some personal services contracts were paid jointly with "Appropriations" and "Receipts" funds, and the actual amount for each source could not be determined. The "Appropriations" funds are the funds appropriated by the General Assembly each year. Funding sources for the "Receipts" include federal, fees, gifts, and other.

DEFINITIONS OF TYPES OF PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACTS

A Personal Services Contract is defined as:

An agreement for services provided by a professional individual on a temporary or occasional basis (e.g. engineer, speechwriter, nurse, accountant). This may also included advisory consulting services. People retained under the "Personal Services Contracts" umbrella include both those which have withholding by the state and those for whom the agency prepares a Form 1099.

Type of Service Contract	Description
Architectural Services (professional & non- professional)	includes building design, interiors, space use, site planning, utilities architecture, energy management, landscape, flood control, drafting, surveying, etc.
Business & Financial Services	accounting, auditing, cash management, financial advisory, investment consulting, collection services, as well as organizational and other general management consulting services
Communications & Media Services	includes motion picture/television/video/audio production, journalistic/professional writer services, speechwriting, graphic arts, advertising services, etc.
Educational Services	includes teaching and instruction services, workshop facilitation, workshop organization and management, course development, etc.
Engineering Professional Services	includes civil, geological, machine, electrical, structural, general, agricultural, foundation, energy management, and other engineering services
Information Technology Services	includes telecommunication consulting, EDI, applications and systems analysis, etc.
Interpretation Services	includes signing, interpreting, translation, etc.
Health & Medical Services	includes physician, nursing, dental, mental health, x-ray, laboratory, pharmacy, audiology, hygiene, vaccination, waste disposal, etc.
Human Services	includes barber/beautician, funeral services, referral services, working with special populations, counseling, case management, community relations, etc.
Legal & Law Enforcement Services	includes attorneys, paralegal, other court-related services such as court stenography services, as well as security analysts, security personnel, other law enforcement or correctional system specialists
Management Services	includes parking management, records management, insurance/risk management, exhibition/market management, building management, waste management services
Scientific Services	includes laboratory services, sampling, leak detection, other specialty services
Transportation Services	self-explanatory
Other	all others
