NC Office of Strategic Partnerships (OSP)

OSP develops, launches, and enhances partnerships between state government and North Carolina's research and philanthropic sectors. This includes elevating state government's internal capacity to use and generate evidence in its policy and programmatic functions. - <u>Evidence Advisor</u>: The Evidence Advisor works directly with state agency partners, leading research
 projects that support OSP's work to build internal state government capacity for evidence-based

 - OSP and NC Department of Adult Correction (NCDAC) <u>partnership</u>: OSP and NCDAC are partnering on an initiative to help NCDAC develop evidence to inform its policy, programmatic, and operational decisions. This article describes the partnership and its impact.
- North Carolina Project Portal: OSP developed the Project Portal to share opportunities for partnering
 with state agencies on their research needs and for people to express interest in pursuing those
 opportunities.

NC Department of Health Human Services (NCDHHS)

NCDHHS is responsible for ensuring the health, safety, and well-being of all North Carolinians.

• Chief Data Officer: The NCDHHS Chief Data Officer assists the Department in developing a strategy to use information to inform and evaluate policy and improve the health and well-being of residents of North Carolina. The ncIMPACT Initiative (ncIMPACT)

Launched in 2017 by the <u>UNC School of Government</u>, ncIMPACT is a statewide endeavor that strives to support local communities across North Carolina.

- ncIMPACT partners with state and local leaders to foster launching multi-year projects using a <u>cross-sector collaborative approach</u> to tackle complex issues like the <u>opioid epidemic</u>, <u>educational</u> attainment, workforce development, and suicide prevention.
 - o ncIMPACT engages with campus experts and outside organizations to deliver strategies, tools, and lessons learned in response to community needs. This has included increasing awareness about the Earned Income Tax Credit, offering resources through the Keys to Economic Recovery from COVID-19 project, and conducting focus groups to help communities understand and respond to issues like workforce retention (Where Are The Workers?) and pandemic recovery (NC Pandemic Recovery Focus Group Report).
