SUBJECT: New Grant Award

Pursuant to G.S. 143C-5-4(9) the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) submits the attached Notification of Grant Award (Warren G Buffet Foundation – NC Collaborative Model to Improve Human Trafficking Investigations and Victim Support Services) for consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

The State Bureau of Investigations has been awarded the NC Collaborative Model to Improve Human Trafficking Investigations and Victim Support Services grant. The award amount is \$9,600,000. Pending consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the start for the award will be 01/16/2024 and the award will have a duration of five years. The award does not require a match obligation.

As the leading criminal investigative agency in our state, the State Bureau of Investigation's strategy for combatting trafficking requires an innovative approach that serves victims of trafficking while enforcement agencies pursue traffickers. This project will provide funding for five years to support eight (8) victim services positions at a non-governmental agency called "Safe Alliance" which operates out of Charlotte, NC. Some funds will also be used to support six (6) time limited FTEs at the NC Conference of District Attorneys. As many as seven (7) additional positions will be housed at the SBI as time limited positions. Funding will be provided over five years. Training and equipment funds are also provided by the grant. Human Trafficking investigations require innovative solutions. By supporting services for victims as well as enforcement operations within the same project, the SBI hopes to engage this pervasive issue more effectively with this award. The project team anticipates having access to these funds for five years. Any unspent funds will be returned to the Buffett Foundation.

OSBM has approved this new funding, and submits the notice of Grant Award for consultation.
